On Day 6 the syllabus has the summary session as the last session following Leaving a Legacy.

After Leaving a Legacy the participants are have been told the greastest secret of leadership and the presentation emotionally engages and charges them. If you then go into the summary session of what they have learned during the course it is like deflating a balloon and they go from the emotional high of Leaving a Legacy and telling them it is their move to just another presentation.

We have found it more effective to switch the presentations and do the summary presentation of what they have learned throughout the course and end that session by referring to now you will have your final presentation of Leaving a legacy and the greatest secret of leadership. The Course Director then does the Leaving a Leagcy presentation making it as personal as they can and with the final slide and instruction of "It's your move." That is followed by the slide show of pictures of the participants taken during the course and those we asked them to send in of them in Scouting prior to the course set to It's in Everyone of Us and then proceeding to the final Gilwell Field.

I would suggest you switch those presentation in the syllabus.
