SMART goal: As a recruitment or advancement program, I will seek out a Unit (or two depending on size) within the Huguenot Trail District for Scouts in an urban/rural community and will teach them about aerodynamics and kite-making. This will include bringing an expert Champion Kite-maker and flyer to assist in the delivery of the program. We will bring kite-making kits and after delivering the lesson, I will use the EDGE method to teach the Scouts how to make a kite, and then allow them to make their own kite. Then, weather permitting, we will go and fly a kite.

Who: Huguenot Trail District Scouts (up to 40)

What: Teaching the youth about aerodynamics and kites.

Where: TBD on the site. I will identify the Pack with assistance of the Huguenot Trail District Executive and make the necessary arrangements from there.

When: Depending on the Pack availability either in the Fall of 2017 or the Spring of 2018.

Why: Many children have never learned the basics of aerodynamics or experienced the thrill of making their own kite and having it fly. It is a simple gesture but builds upon the boys' ability to dream and to create their own path.

How: Lead the training, supply the kite kits, use the EDGE method to deliver how and then enjoy our results.

How you will determine the task is complete: Once the event has been taught and the children (up to 40 - as an idea of how many I can do at one time) have been involved in the meeting and made their own kites.
