SMART goal: I will make a presentation to leaders to try to encourage the use of older scouts as troop guides for the 11 year old scout patrol.

Who: Me

What: Presentation to Young Men/ Scout/ Chartered Organization leaders to try to encourage older scouts (ages 14+) to become troop guides for the 11 year old scout patrol (and possibly the 12-13 year old scout patrol as well). _____

Where: Committee Meeting

When: By 12/31/17

Why: Because the church uses scouting as a major component of its' young men's program, which starts at the age of 12, scouts who are 11 years old have little interaction with the older boys other than Courts of Honor and a few campouts. By bringing in older boys, they gain experience in leadership positions. We also only have one 11 year old scout so interaction with other youth is important. These older scouts will also act as a mentor to this scout, encouraging him to work on rank advancement and providing him an insight in what's to come as he gets older.

How: I will put together a presentation using experiences I've had in the troop as well as experiences with a troop guide in the Wood Badge course to help leaders see the benefit of this program. I will also try to address known concerns in doing this and then prepare myself for questions that will come as a result. I will invite the Bishopric, Young Men and Primary Leaders to this meeting. _____

The team that will benefit from my leadership: Troop

SMART goal: I will Organize and help teach an "Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops" course to our troop.

Who: Troop Leaders (Adult leaders teaching)/ All scouts invited

What: Youth Leadership Training Course

Where: Church building or campout devoted to training.

When: By 5/31/18

Why: Most of our youth leaders do not know how to run the troop/ patrol. Most of what they know how to do is stand up and conduct a meeting. Because we have one boy in our patrol, I will invite the other patrols. Because most boys will at some point serve in a leadership position, I will invite all boys to attend. I will also teach the patrol method so having more boys will allow that to happen more effectively. Youth leaders also have crossover responsibilities with church responsibilities. While courses like NYLT and others are available, parents have been reluctant to send their boys due to cost. While not offering the same level of experience, this course will allow them a better chance to learn how scouting is operated and see their role in it. _____

How: I will take the "Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops" course designed for scoutmasters to teach youth leaders and adjust it as needed. These adjustments will include how their church leadership positions coincide and how they can accomplish both at once. I will also modify it to include more specifics on the patrol method and allow them to model this much like we do in Wood Badge. Through teaching, troop adult leaders can better see how they can fulfill their responsibilities. I will invite other LDS Leaders and Scouts to participate.

How you will determine the task is complete: The class is taught.
