Where: I will work on this goal at home (planning the presentations) and at Troop meetings, troop camping trips, or both (performing the presentations).

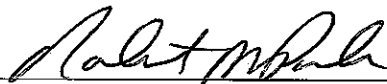
When: I will work on this goal over the next eighteen months.

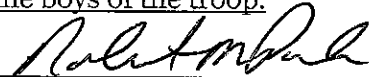
Where: I will work on this goal at home (researching, designing, and printing the cookbooks) and at a troop meeting (distributing the cookbooks).

Where: I will work on this goal at home, at troop meetings, and on a camping trip.

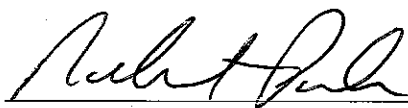
