Goal #1

What: Talk to SPL and review the purpose and composition of the PLC. Request that he setup a recurring meeting, recommending monthly. Offer to assist with deconflicting schedules. Also talk to Key 3 at next Committee meeting (13 NOV) and review same topics.

Where: Committee meeting and after a troop meeting.

When: 13 NOV for committee and at the next Troop meeting for SPL

Why: A PLC will allow the troop to reach a new level of scout leadership, providing a dedicated forum for guidance and mentoring by the adult leaders. It will empower the PLC and the SPL with a new sense of purpose and responsibility for the Troop that they lead.

How: Express my point of view through reasoned dialog and interaction, referencing the Troop Leader's Guidebook, the Senior Patrol Leader's Handbook, and the training I have received at Wood Badge.

Complete: The task will be complete when I have made my case to the SPL and the Committee, both of which will occur in fall 2017.

SMART Goal: Present to the SPL and the Key 3 the benefits of utilizing the patrol method, demonstrate some key aspects of the method, and conduct training for Patrol leaders on the patrol method.

Who: patrols and patrol leaders

What: Increase the *esprit de corps* of the patrols in the troop through the use of the patrol method

Where: Committee meeting and PLC meeting, or after a troop meeting.

When: By May 2017

Why: The patrol method is fundamental to teaching boys to lead, encouraging friendly competition, striving for excellence, and re-visiting basic Scoutcraft skills.
