One of the many fun, supervised activities they enjoy is Nerf Wars, where the students apply engineering principles to their Nerf weaponry to make it better. This is a controlled combat game where safety is enforced, but as with any activity, accidents can occur. Halloween weekend, after Nerf Wars had concluded for the evening, one young man in my son's hall was enthusiastically leaping out of a stairwell and struck his head on the door frame. Hard. When my son and two other young men came upon this injured student, they immediately went into action. "Dad, there was blood everywhere, and the guy was starting to freak out," my son relayed to me. One of the three first responders went to call emergency services and guide them to the location of the injured party. My son went to the RA's room to get the first aid kit and when he returned, he and the other young man treated the injured man using first aid skills they'd each learned in Scouting.
