Guide to Using This CD-ROM

Navigation

The Contents file is the core of this Wood Badge for the 21st Century 2001 Training CD-ROM. From it, you can click on any other file and go directly to it. All files are in .PDF format, which may be viewed and printed with Adobe Acrobat Reader software. For the best results, turn off (uncheck) the Open Cross-Doc Links in the Same Window preference in Adobe Acrobat Reader. To change the preference, go to the File menu under Preferences, General.

Navigating Within a File

Within a file, you can scroll from page to page or you can use Adobe Acrobat thumbnails (see Adobe Acrobat Reader Guide below). You can print the entire file or only selected pages.

Adobe Acrobat Reader Guide

From the Contents file, you can click on any of the links under Adobe Acrobat Reader Guide. The guide is a comprehensive document provided with Adobe Acrobat Reader. It covers more features of the software than you will need for this use, so the links provided direct you to the features you are most likely to need. Those are Paging Through a Document, Browsing With Thumbnails, Browsing With Bookmarks, Following Links, and Retracing Your Steps.
