# PREFACE

Migration is a complex issue, which comes with opportunities and challenges. In the currently challenging geopolitical times we are living through, migration is set to remain an important priority for the EU. Indeed, the European Council concluded its special meeting on 9 February 2023 by recognising that migration is a European challenge that requires a European response.

This is all the more important in the context of recent events such as the devastating earthquake that struck Türkiye-Syria in February 2023, the displacement of people from Ukraine that has been occurring for over a year, and migrant shipwrecks in the Mediterranean, such as the one in the Calabria region of the South of Italy in February 2023.

Understanding migratory movements and how they evolve over time is essential for effective migration policymaking.

In 2022, there were an estimated 281 million international migrants in the world. This corresponds to about 3.6% of the total global population. International migrants are therefore only a small minority of the global population, while the great majority of people still live in their countries of birth, with the majority of human mobility happening within countries.

The majority of international migrants move via legal channels. Each year, between two and three million nationals from non-EU countries come to the EU legally. Legal migration can help address skills needs in the long term, and is essential for the EU's economic recovery.

However, poverty, social and political instability, and the limited availability of legal migration pathways, push people towards criminal networks, which facilitate their unauthorised entry in the EU.

2022 was marked with increasing pressures on the EU's external borders, and a series of events with repercussions for migration, asylum and border management in the EU.

Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 caused the fastest and largest forced displacement of people in Europe since the Second World War. By the end of 2022, around 7 million people had fled the country, the majority of them to EU Member States.

Irregular arrivals to the European Union increased across all routes. In particular, there was a continued pressure on the routes across the Mediterranean and the Western Balkans. The European Border and Coast Guard Agency (Frontex) reported 330 000 irregular border crossings in 2022, which is a 64% increase compared to 2021, and the highest annual figure since 2016.

In this context, the 2022 edition of the Atlas of Migration provides harmonised and validated data on migration for the 27 EU Member States and 198 countries and territories around the world. These data are presented in individual country profiles, and overviews for continents and sub-continental regions.

The 2022 edition includes a thematic section that provides new insights on the displacement from Ukraine following Russia's aggression. It quantifies the level of displacement, and explores the distribution of people fleeing the war in Ukraine across the EU Member States, together with their age, gender, nationality and trends over time.

Overall, the Atlas of Migration is an excellent example of the innovation and rigour the Joint Research Centre (JRC) brings in support of evidence-based policymaking in the area of migration.

# INTRODUCTION

After a significant drop in the number of international migrants in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, international migration bounced back in 2021 and available data suggests that it continued to grow in 2022.

The number of refugees in the world has grown by more than 6 million in the last two years. According to UNHCR, there were 26.4 million refugees at the end of 2020, 27.1 million at the end of 2021 and 32.5 million as of mid-2022.<sup>1</sup> In the European Union (EU), the number of refugees more than doubled between 2020 and 2022, passing from 2.7 million to 6.7 million. This figure includes the approximately 3.7 million people displaced from Ukraine. As of mid-2022, the EU Member States hosted 21% of the world's refugees (against 10% in 2020).

After a drop in the number of residence permits issued in the EU from 2019 to 2020, the number increased in 2021 despite the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. Almost 3 million residence permits were issued by the EU Member States to non-EU citizens in 2021.<sup>2</sup> Of these, 30% were issued to Ukrainian citizens. In 2021, the number of residence permits issued for work-related reasons hit a record high (1.3 million). In 2021, 45 % of all first residence permits were issued for work reasons.

In the EU, Poland issued the highest number of first residence permits to non-EU citizens (967 300), accounting for 33 % of total number of permits issued in the EU. It was followed by Spain (371 800 - 13 % of total EU permits), France (285 200 - 10 %), Italy (274 100 - 9 %), Germany (185 600 - 6 %) and the Netherlands (103 600 - 4 %). Together, these six Member States accounted for 74 % of all first residence permits issued in the EU in 2021.

After a drop in the number of first time asylum applications in the EU in 2020, the numbers started going up in 2021 and then increased sharply in 2022, going from 52 885 in January 2022 to 99 205 in November 2022 (last month for which data is available). In November 2022, Syrians were the largest group of persons seeking asylum (17 705 first-time applicants), followed by Afghans (13 065) and Turks (7 495).<sup>3</sup>

Following Russia's military aggression against Ukraine, there was a sharp increase in the number of first-time asylum applications by Ukrainian citizens in the first quarter of 2022 (from 2 105 in February to 12 190 in March). The

numbers decreased as from April (from 1 455 in April to 1 060 in November), following the adoption of the Temporary Protection Directive.

Also returns increased during 2022. 83 005 non-EU citizens were ordered to leave an EU Member State in the first quarter, 96 550 in the second quarter and 107 825 in the third quarter. The number of orders to leave was 12 % higher in the third quarter compared with the second quarter of 2022, and 28 % higher compared with the third quarter of 2021.<sup>4</sup>

19 390 persons were returned to another country (including other EU Member States) following an order to leave in the first quarter, 22 525 in the second quarter and 29 730 in the third quarter. The number of persons returned to another country in the third quarter was up 32 %, compared with the second quarter of 2022, and an increase of 49 % compared with the same period of 2021.

The Atlas of Migration illustrates these and other harmonised and validated data on migration by country, continent and sub-continental region.

By making global migration data easy to understand, the Atlas of Migration guides policymakers, researchers and the general public through the complexities of international migration.

The 2022 edition also includes a thematic section, which provides new insights on the displacement from Ukraine following Russia's aggression.

# HOW TO READ

This section covers each of the 27 EU Member States (MSs) and the EU.

The charts are organised in thematic parts. More detailed information is available in the Technical Notes at the end of this section.

The data refers to 2021. Whenever 2021 data is not available from the original source, latest available values are provided. If there is no data the corresponding field is either missing or indicated as 'N/A'.

Note that in some cases, the sum of percentages or of individual values might not add up to 100 or to the total value. This is due to rounding and confidence intervals applied by the source.

## OVERVIEW [at 1st January] (Eurostat)

### Population - 2021 (in thousands)

The donut chart shows the number of people residing in the MS by broad group of citizenship. The groups are 'nationals', 'EU mobile', 'non-EU' (which includes also 'Stateless' and 'Unknown'). The total population of the country is in the centre.

### Annual flows - 2020 (in thousands)

The two bar charts show the scale of migration to and from the MS. The left bar shows the number of people who have immigrated to the MS over the last year. 'within EU' immigration refers to people who are citizens of other EU MSs. 'outside EU' immigration refers to non-EU citizens.

The right bar shows the number of people who have emigrated from the MS over the last year, moving to another MS ('within EU') or to a non-EU country/territory ('outside EU'). The total numbers of immigrants and emigrants are on the top of each respective bar.

## ASYLUM (Eurostat)

### First time applications

The chart shows the number of people who have made a first application for asylum in the MS during a year. The data covers the last years and is broken down by sex. The total annual figure is shown on the right.

### First instance decisions

The chart shows the distribution of decisions on first asylum applications in the MS by outcome: 'Geneva' for 'Geneva convention status'; 'Subsid.' for 'Subsidiary protection'; 'Human.' for 'Humanitarian protection'; and 'Reject.' for 'Rejected application'. The total number of decisions on first applications for asylum during a year is shown on the right.

### Foreign citizens who have acquired citizenship during the year

Each of the pie charts, together with the relative number on the bottom, shows how many people from other countries and territories have acquired the citizenship of the MS per year. The data is broken down into (a) people whose previous citizenship was of another MS ('EU mobile') and (b) people whose previous citizenship was of a 'non-EU' country/territory (including both 'Stateless' and 'Unknown').

## DEMOGRAPHY [at 1st January] (Eurostat)

### Population pyramid - 2021 (in thousand)

The chart shows the demographic composition of the population in the MS. It indicates the number of people by age group, sex (males and females) and broad group of citizenship (shown from the outside to the inside of the pyramid), specifically 'nationals' (citizens of the MS), 'EU mobile' (citizens of the other 26 MSs) and 'non-EU' citizens (which includes also 'Stateless' and 'Unknown'). The original Eurostat data is organised in five-year cohorts and has been aggregated to obtain ten-year cohorts. The data refers to the population as of 1st January.

## SCHENGEN VISAS (HOME)

### Visas applied for, issued and not issued (in thousands)

Each donut chart shows the percentage of Schengen visas issued and not issued per year. The number in the centre shows the total number of visas applied for during each year.

The figure refers to the sum of uniform visas (including MEVs), LTVs, and ATVs. For detailed description, see Technical Notes.

Note that for Romania, Bulgaria & Croatia the data on LTV visas is missing.

## RESIDENCE PERMITS (Eurostat)

### First residence permits issued during the year

The chart shows the number of people who have received a particular residence permit for the first time during a year, for the last four years (annual flow of resident permits). The reasons for issuing permits are 'Work', 'Family', 'Education' or 'Other' (which includes international protection).

### Valid residence permits at the end of the year

The chart shows the number of migrants residing in the MS with different types of residence permits and with permits that are valid for at least five years (national and EU long term residence permits). This shows the total number of permits held by people in the country at the end of the reference year (the migrant stock). The reasons for valid permits are the same listed above.

## IRREGULAR MIGRATION (Eurostat)

### Persons ordered to leave, persons returned and return rate

The bar shows the number of people who have been 'Ordered to leave' the MS and the circle shows those 'Returned to a third country/territory' following an order to leave per year.

### Return rate

The return rate on the right is calculated as the ratio between the number of people returned to a third country/territory following an order to leave and the people who received an order to leave. Since it is calculated on annual data, it might result higher than 100%, because of administrative backlogs.

## SOCIAL INCLUSION (Eurostat)

Each of the pie charts, together with the relative number, shows how many people from other countries and territories have acquired the citizenship of the MS per year. The data is broken down into (a) people whose previous citizenship was of another MS ('EU Mobile') and (b) people whose previous citizenship was of a 'Non-EU' country/territory (including both 'Stateless' and 'Unknown').

[Median equivalised net income \(18+\) 2021 \[EUR\]](#) shows differences in income levels for adults by broad group of citizenship. The values are in euro.

[Household overcrowding rate \(18+\) 2021 \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of adults by broad group of citizenship who live in a household defined as 'overcrowded'.

[Persons at risk of poverty or social exclusion \(18+\) 2020 \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of adults by broad group of citizenship who are either at risk of poverty, face serious material deprivation or live in a household defined as having a 'very low work intensity'.

[At risk of poverty rate for children 2021 \[%\]](#) indicates the percentage of people under 18 (by citizenship of their parents: Nationals vs Non-Nationals) who are defined as being 'at risk of poverty'.

## EDUCATION (Eurostat)

The three charts show differences in educational attainment and participation in education by broad group of citizenship: 'nationals', 'EU mobile' and 'non-EU'.

[Population \(25-64\) by educational attainment 2021 \[%\]](#) refers to the proportion of people aged between 25 and 64 by their education level. 'LOW (lev 0-2)' refers to Less than primary, primary and lower secondary education; 'MEDIUM (lev 3-4)' refers to Upper secondary and post-secondary, non-tertiary, education, and 'HIGH (lev 5-8)' refers to Tertiary education.

[NEET \(18-24\) 2021 \[%\]](#) shows the proportion of people aged between 18 and 24 who are 'Neither Employed nor in Education or Training' in the four weeks preceding the survey.

[Early school leavers \(18-24\) 2021 \[%\]](#) shows the proportion of people aged between 18 and 24 which has completed no more than lower secondary education and is not involved in further education or training.

## LABOUR MARKET (Eurostat)

The four charts present employment and unemployment related indicators by broad group of citizenship ('nationals', 'EU mobile' and 'non-EU') and sex. Three charts show also a breakdown by age group, whereas the fourth one by education attainment. This section shows similarities and differences in integration of these subgroups in the labour market.

[Employment rate 2021 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of the total working-age population which is employed within each age group.

[Employment rate 2021 by educational attainment and sex \[%\]](#) shows employment rates of working-age population (15-64 years old) by level of educational attainment. 'LOW' refers to Less than primary, primary and lower secondary education; 'MEDIUM' refers to Upper secondary and post-secondary, non-tertiary, education, and 'HIGH' refers to Tertiary education.

[Unemployment rate 2021 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) indicates the percentage of unemployed people in the labour force. It is calculated as the ratio between the unemployed population and the sum of employed and unemployed population within the same group.

[Long term unemployment rate 2021 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) refers to people who have been unemployed for more than one year. It is calculated as the proportion of the total unemployed population within each group which has been unemployed for more than one year.

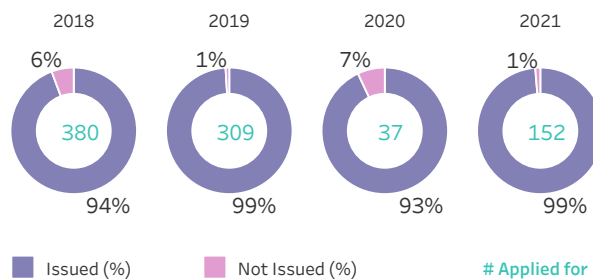
Annual flows 2020 (in thousands)

# HOW TO READ

Whenever 2021 data is not available from the original source, latest available values are provided. If there is no data the corresponding field is either missing or indicated as 'N/A'

Note that in some cases, the sum of percentages or of individual values might not add up to 100 or to the total value. This is due to rounding and confidence intervals.

The chart is relative to migrant population estimates (stock) at mid-year. The four bars on the left shows the total number of people residing in the country/territory who have immigrated from the EU ('EU') or from somewhere else in the world ('other'). The four bars on the right shows the total number of people from the country/territory who have emigrated to the EU ('EU') or to somewhere else in the world ('other').

UNDESA estimates on migration stocks are available every five years, with a two-year revision as of 2017.

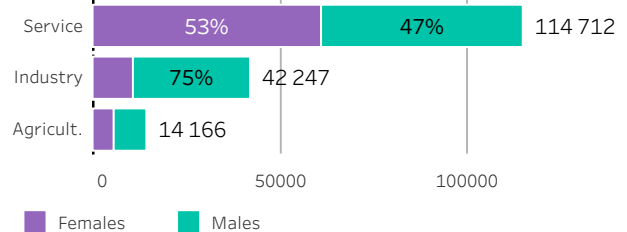

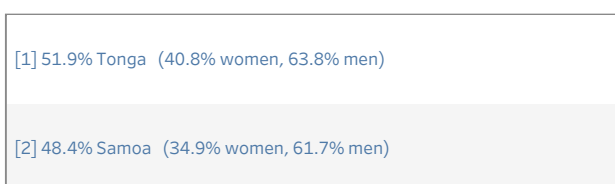
Labour force participation (15 years and older) [%]

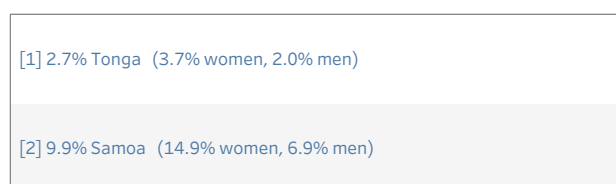
Employment 2021 by economic sector and sex [thousand]

# 1. INTRODUCTION

The Russian military aggression against Ukraine that started on 24 February 2022 bears major consequences not only for Ukraine and its neighbouring countries, but at a wider global level. It poses threats to the rules-based international order, and presents challenges for food security, global supply chains, trade, energy security, and migration. In this section of the Atlas of Migration, we focus on the implications of the war on the management of migration and asylum in the EU.

The EU and Ukraine signed an association agreement in 2014, entered into force in 2017.<sup>1</sup> In parallel, since 2017, Ukrainian citizens can enter and move visa-free within the Schengen area for up to 90 days. Due to geographical proximity, historical and economic ties, as well as the political position taken on the war, the EU has received the highest share of people fleeing Ukraine.

The EU had to deal with unprecedented volumes of people seeking protection in terms of scale and speed. In response, the EU adapted its asylum governance and activated, for the first time, the **Temporary Protection Directive (TPD)**, with the Council decision of 4 March 2022.<sup>2</sup> The TPD is an instrument that was adopted in 2001 to deal with high numbers of people seeking protection, without creating an unmanageable burden on the EU Member State's asylum systems.

In order to support the TPD implementation, the European Commission (EC) established the **EU Solidarity with Ukraine**<sup>3</sup> platform, which acts as a discussion forum for Member States for all migratory and security consequences of the war in the EU territory. Chaired by the EC, the platform brings together EU institutions and agencies, EU Member States and Schengen Associated Countries, international organisations such as the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and the International Organization for Migration (IOM), as well as Ukrainian and Moldovan authorities. The platform has played a crucial role in ensuring a coordinated response, notably through the operationalisation of the 10-Point Plan on welcoming people fleeing the war approved at the Justice and Home Affairs Council of 28 March 2022.<sup>4</sup>

In addition, the EC has fully mobilised the **Blueprint Network**. This is a network of EU services and agencies, national authorities, and international organisations that shares updated information and data on the developments at the borders with Ukraine, including on the number of people entering and leaving, their needs, the protection offered in the EU Member States and Schengen Associated Countries.<sup>5</sup> Furthermore, the EU has supported the Member States in fostering Ukrainians' access to education, healthcare, accommodation and to the labour market.<sup>6</sup>

The EU reacted quickly and implemented unprecedented measures. However, in the medium term, the resilience of the Member States' migration management systems will be measured not only in terms of their capacity to process asylum applications, but also in terms of ensuring a sustainable path of integration into education and the labour market for beneficiaries of the temporary protection.

## 2. THE MAGNITUDE OF THE DISPLACEMENT AND TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN THE EU

### 2.1 THE MAGNITUDE OF THE DISPLACEMENT

Individual countries collect data from border authorities and international organisations like UNHCR and EU Agencies, like Frontex, gather all the data together. However, they should not be interpreted as a precise number. EU-bound crossings refer to Ukrainians, as well as other third-country nationals fleeing the country, and may include movements of people who were not residing in Ukraine prior to the invasion (e.g., Ukrainians who live in the EU who were temporarily back in Ukraine). The trajectories of people fleeing a war are often non-linear. They may be circular, short-term, and the same person may be moving multiple times. Moreover, parts of such movements may occur under different legal frameworks, which may or may not require notification to the authorities. That is why the numbers on displacement indicate orders of magnitude, rather than exact figures.

Based on various sources, **by December 2022, between 3.6 and 5.4 million people were internally displaced in Ukraine, while at least 7 million had moved out of the country.**<sup>7</sup> The war has thus displaced between 25% and 30% of the total Ukrainian population (of approximately 41 million). According to IOM (IOM DTM 2022) most of the 3.6 million people officially registered as internally displaced, originated from the regional administrative units (oblasts) of Donetsk, Kharkivska, and Zaporiska. However, the same source suggests that the actual number of internally displaced people may be two thirds higher, i.e. 5.4 million (IOM 2023).

Since the start of the Russian invasion, UNHCR estimates that **more than 16.9 million border crossings from**

**Ukraine** to Poland (8.5 million), Hungary (2 million), Romania (1.7 million),<sup>8</sup> Slovakia (1 million), as well as Moldova (700 000) were recorded up until 27 December 2022 (UNHCR Operational data portal). At the same time, more than 2.8 million people have reportedly crossed to the Russian Federation and 16 700 to Belarus, although the willingness of some of these movements is contested.<sup>9</sup>

Many Ukrainian citizens returned to Ukraine. The number of **crossings to Ukraine** from EU neighbouring countries amounted to 9 million, as of 27 December 2022.<sup>10</sup> A comparison between the incoming and outgoing flows shows that for every two crossings towards EU Member States, at least one crossing back to Ukraine was registered (UNHCR Operational data portal).

### 2.2 DISPLACEMENT IN THE EU

It is not easy to precisely determine how many people fleeing Ukraine are in the EU. Data collected by Eurostat on beneficiaries of temporary protection is the best indicator to capture the number of those whose intention is to remain in a Member State for at least one year. By the end of December 2022, there were more than **3.8 million beneficiaries** of temporary protection in the EU.<sup>11</sup>

Almost all were Ukrainian citizens (3.76 million, equal to 98%). In fact, access to temporary protection is granted also to beneficiaries of international protection (or equivalent to it) in Ukraine and their family members, as well as other third country nationals and stateless persons who can prove that they were legally residing in Ukraine before 24 February

### BOX 1 The application of the Temporary Protection Directive in EU MS.

The Temporary Protection Directive (Article 5) envisages that the existence of mass influx and the specific groups of people to whom it applies are to be established by the specific Council Decision. On 4 March 2022, the Council adopted the implementing decision, covering Ukrainian nationals, as well as beneficiaries of international protection in Ukraine and their family members.

All EU Member States except Denmark are bound by the Temporary Protection Directive. However, Denmark as well as the Schengen Associated countries – Iceland, Norway, Switzerland and Lichtenstein – have all introduced schemes similar to the Temporary Protection Directive.<sup>1</sup> The duration of the temporary protection under the Directive was initially for 1 year. It has been renewed up to March 2024, as agreed by Justice and Home Affairs Council on 14 October 2022.<sup>2</sup>

The Council Decision gives EU Member States the possibility to apply the temporary protection or adequate protection under national law to third-country nationals and stateless persons residing in Ukraine on a permanent basis and unable to return to their country or region of origin. In this latter case, almost all Member States opted for the temporary protection (EMN 2022), while only two (Austria and Greece) decided to refer to international protection. EU Member States may give access to temporary protection also to third-country nationals who were residing in Ukraine but did not benefit from international protection or did not hold permanent residency status, for instance students or workers, if unable to return to their country of origin safely and durably (Article 2(3) of the Council Decision and 7 of the Directive). Croatia, Finland, Germany, Netherlands, Portugal and Spain opted to do so (EMN 2022, EUAA webpage)

Member States dealt with Ukrainian nationals out of their country before the Russian invasion differently. In the case of those with a residence permit about to expire and at risk of not meeting the conditions for renewal, Estonia and Belgium granted an extension, Austria, Netherlands, Portugal and Spain made them eligible for temporary protection, and France opted for an individual-case assessment (EMN 2022; EUAA information webpage). For those who fled Ukraine in the period of the heightened tensions preceding the invasion, almost half of the Member States (Austria, Croatia, Czechia, Estonia, Finland, Greece, Ireland, Netherlands, Portugal, Romania, Spain, Sweden) made the temporary protection available, with different definitions of the cut-off period preceding the war (EMN 2022; EUAA Information webpage). In most cases, this category covers people with no residency status acquired in an EU Member State prior to the war.

2022, on the basis of a valid permanent residence permit, and who are unable to return in safe and durable conditions to their country or region of origin (Box 1).

It should be noted that other options to obtain a residency status are still available for people fleeing Ukraine, such as residence permits for **family reunification, employment or study**,<sup>12</sup> as well as asylum. Between January and November 2022, approximately 22 000 Ukrainian citizens submitted first-time asylum applications. Beneficiaries of temporary protection can lodge an asylum application (Article 17 Temporary Protection Directive). It is up to each Member State to decide whether the status of an asylum seeker and beneficiary of temporary protection can be granted simultaneously (article 19 of the Temporary Protection Directive).

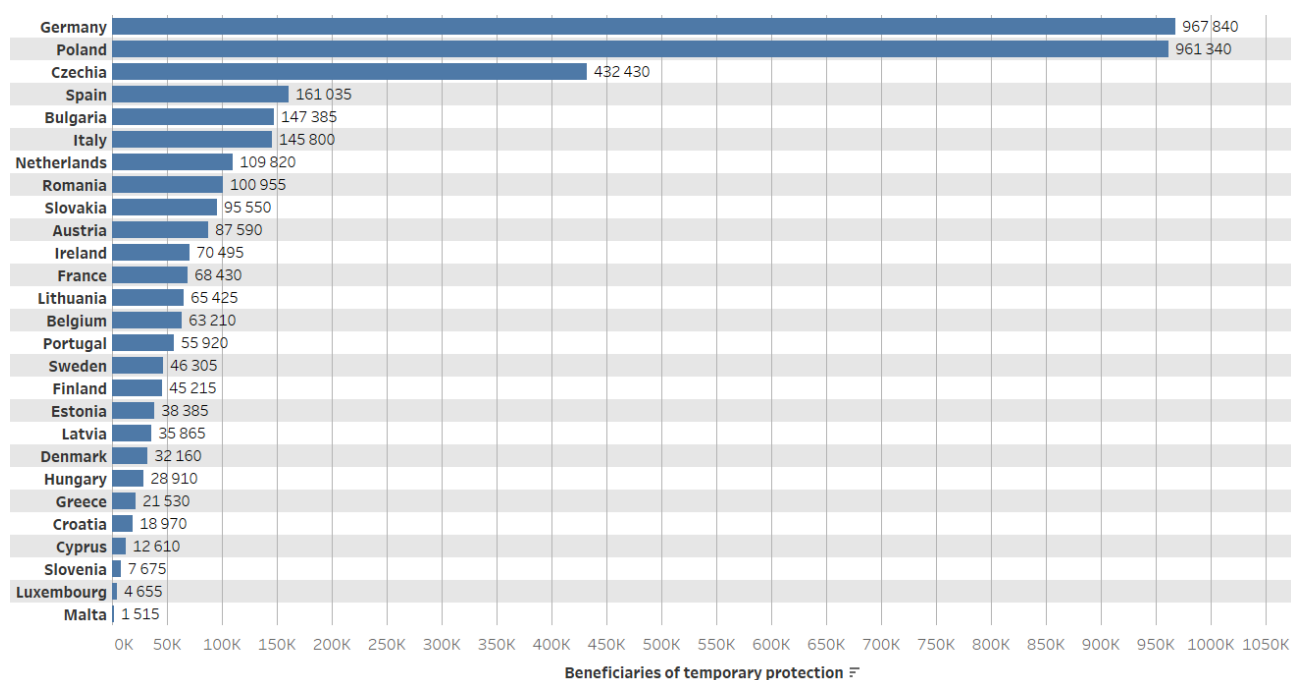
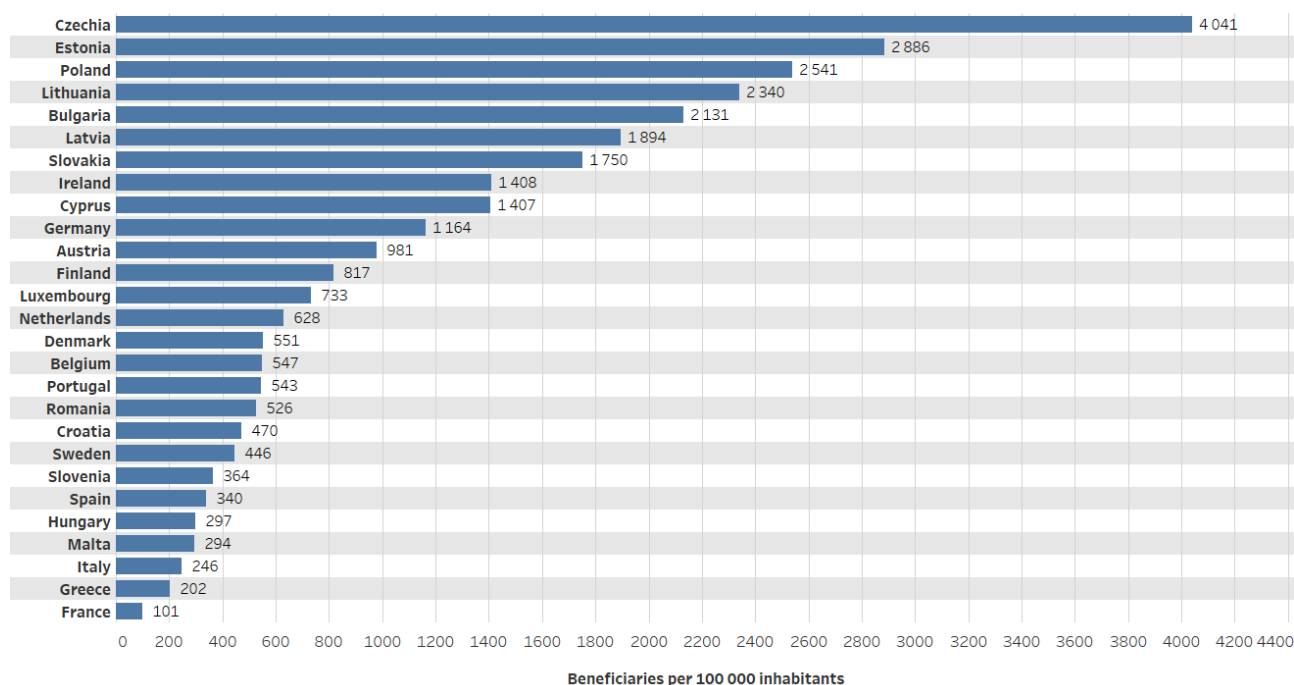
## 2.3 BENEFICIARIES OF TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN EU MEMBER STATES

This section overviews the geographical distribution of the TPD beneficiaries and their composition by age and gender. The distribution of temporary protection beneficiaries across Member States is very uneven. When looking at the **beneficiaries of temporary protection in absolute numbers** at the end of the month (latest available date: December 2022), Germany, Poland, Czechia, Spain and Bulgaria are the top five destination countries (Figure 1).

In terms of **beneficiaries per 100 000 inhabitants**, the five top Member States are Czechia, Estonia, Poland, Lithuania and Bulgaria (Figure 2)

Over time, the intra-EU geographical distribution of people fleeing the war has been changing (Figure 3). In most Member States, the number of beneficiaries is increasing over time, although at a much slower rate than during the first three months after the Russian invasion. Poland, which is the country registering the largest number of beneficiaries, has seen this number decreasing in the final

months of 2022. This temporal distribution may be explained in several ways, linked to the geographical proximity to Ukraine, growing awareness that it was possible to ask for temporary protection in a Member State different from the one of first arrival, or simply Member States' bureaucratic capacity and procedures to process the registrations.

## 2.4 DEMOGRAPHICS OF BENEFICIARIES OF TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN EU MEMBER STATES

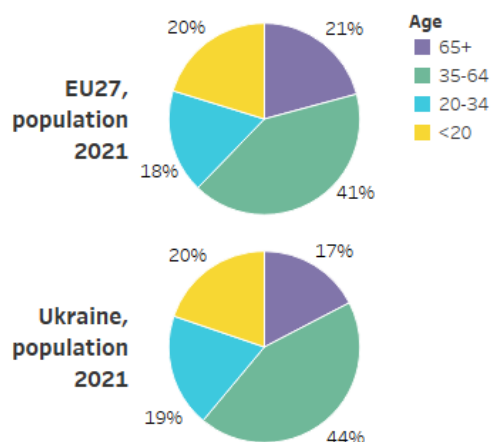
**FIGURE 4.** Age distribution of the beneficiaries of temporary protection in the EU, as of December 2022.

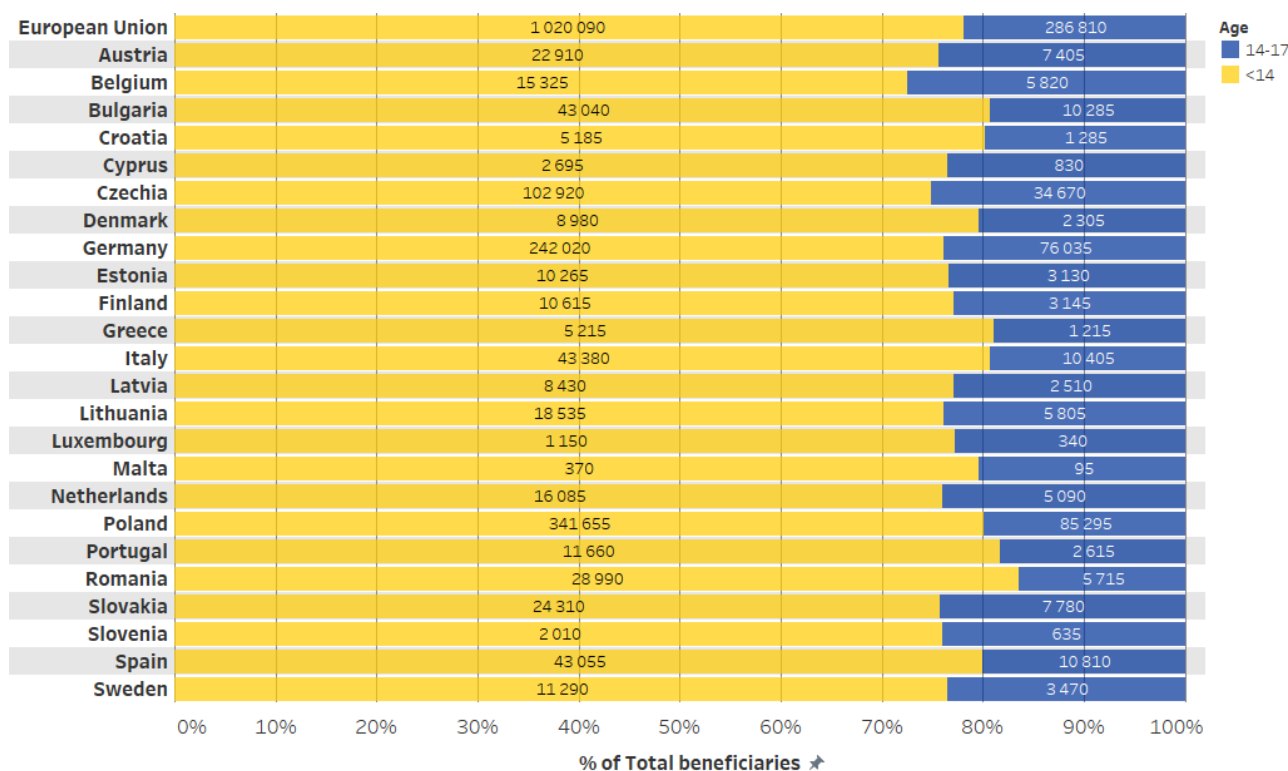
**FIGURE 5.** Age distribution of total population in the EU and in Ukraine in 2021.

The population benefitting from temporary protection in the EU is younger than the population of Ukraine before the war, and younger than the EU population (Figure 4 and Figure 5).<sup>13</sup> In particular, the share of the population below 18 is almost twice as big among the beneficiaries compared to the share of the below-19 age group in the EU population and in the population of Ukraine. The share of the 18-34 age group among the beneficiaries is a third bigger than the share of the age groups 20-34 in the EU and Ukrainian population. Notably, this has similarities with the overall migrant population in the EU which is relatively younger than the natives. This bears policy-relevant indications for Member States concerning the rights associated with temporary protection, primarily in terms of access to education and the labour market.

The share of minors varies by country, reaching for instance

up to 50% in Poland. The vast majority of minors are accompanied.<sup>14</sup> In all EU Member States, the share of the under 14 year-olds is higher than the share of 14-17 year-olds (Figure 6). Hence, the majority of these children are in the age of compulsory education.<sup>15</sup> Member States need to equip properly their educational infrastructure and personnel to keep children fleeing the war in school, including language, social and psychological support, recognition of educational qualifications and adapting their curricula to include competences that are useful for both the host country and the country of origin in view of their return.

In June 2022, the Commission adopted a Staff Working Document detailing considerations, key principles and practices to support the inclusion of displaced children from Ukraine in education, for the school year 2022-2023.<sup>16</sup> The *School Education Gateway* gathers relevant information on education and training for students, schools and teachers on.<sup>17</sup> Most beneficiaries are of working age. Various surveys collected information on the skills and education profiles of

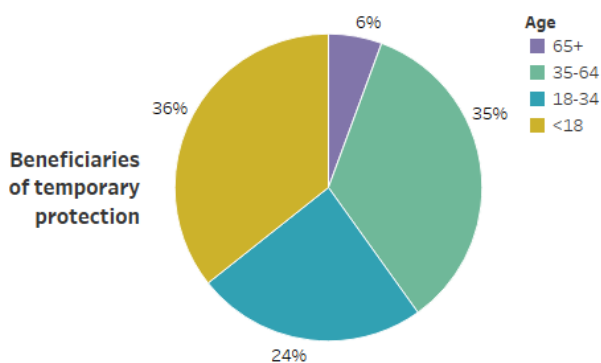

the beneficiaries (EUAA and OECD 2022; IOM 2022; Kantar 2022; Kohlenberger, Pędziwiatr et al. 2022, Panchenko, T. 2022), where the share of tertiary educated tends to be larger (between 50 and 80%) than the one in the general Ukrainian population (30%).

Besides the usual integration activities funded under EU instruments such as the Asylum, Migration and Integration

Fund (AMIF), the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and the European Social Fund (ESF), the EC implemented specific actions for people fleeing the war in Ukraine. These include the *Cohesion's Action for Refugees in Europe (CARE)*,<sup>18</sup> which increases the flexibility of the Cohesion policy rule to fund a variety of initiatives, including support for employment and labour market integration, and measures to facilitate the recognition of academic

and professional qualifications obtained in Ukraine.<sup>19</sup> In addition, in October 2022, the Commission launched the *EU Talent Pool initiative*,<sup>20</sup> to help temporary protection beneficiaries find suitable job opportunities for their period of stay in the EU.

In terms of gender distribution, women represent 7 in 10 of temporary protection beneficiaries over 18 years old (Figure 7). This is primarily explained by the provision adopted in Ukraine that restricts men between 18 and 60 from leaving the country. The vast majority of the beneficiaries are women in all EU Member States, although there are some small differences, for instance the share of men amounting to almost 40% in Portugal.

Evidence from surveys (e.g., UNHCR 2022) suggests a significant presence of mothers who arrive alone. This would entail specific psychological support for women and children separated from family members, but also childcare assistance for mothers who want to participate in the labour market. However, over time the share of men among beneficiaries increased. In the EU, it was 14% in the first quarter of 2022, 21% in the second and 33% in the third quarter. This trend is common to the vast majority of Member States. It is still unclear whether this may indicate

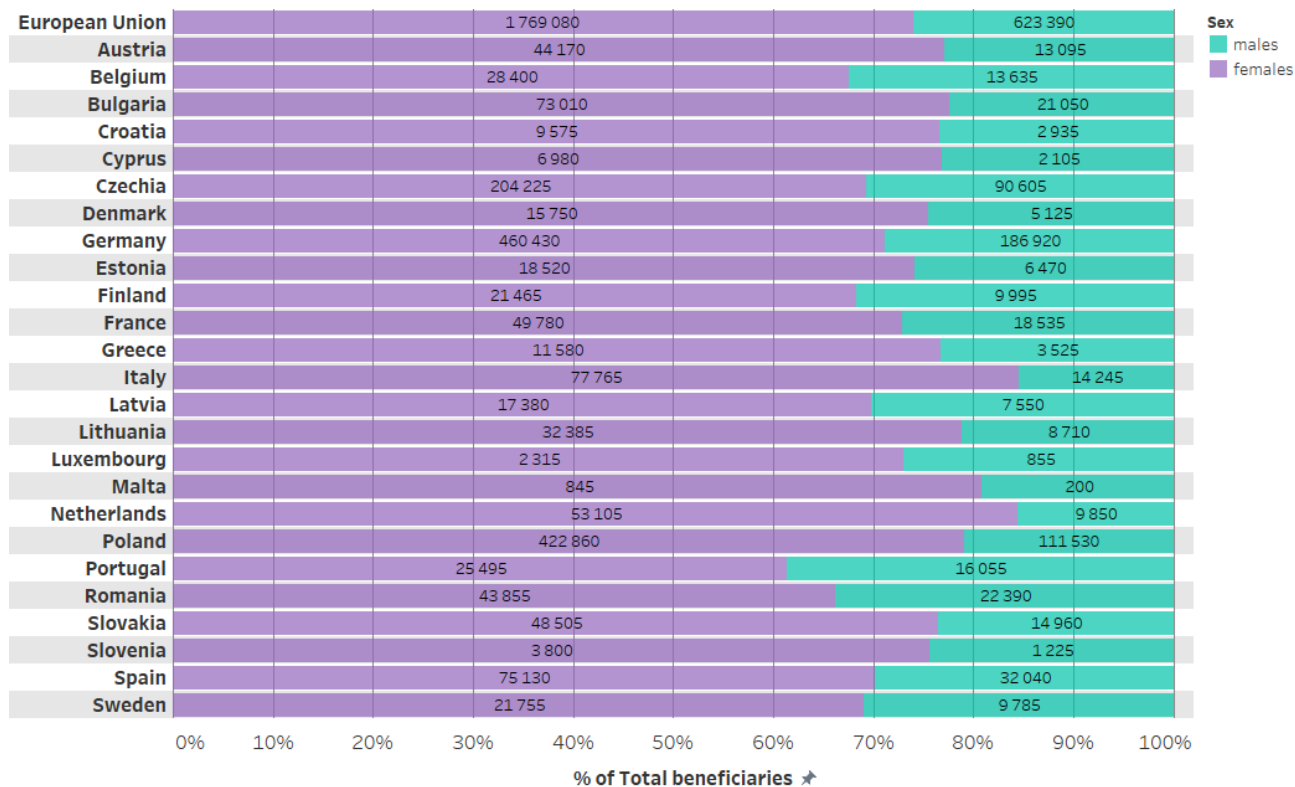
that families are reuniting as soon as men are able to leave Ukraine.

Non-Ukrainian nationals accounts for approximately 2% of the beneficiaries of temporary protection. The top countries of citizenship are Russia, Nigeria, Morocco and Belarus. Russia and Belarus are also the top countries of birth of foreign citizens residing in Ukraine in 2020,<sup>21</sup> while Morocco and Nigeria are among the top five countries of origin of foreign students in Ukraine (along with India, Turkmenistan, Azerbaijan).<sup>22</sup>

The Member States hosting the largest share of non-Ukrainian nationals among the temporary protection beneficiaries are Portugal (21%), Netherlands (7%) and France (5%). Both Netherlands and Portugal granted a liberal access to temporary protection, which also covers third country nationals who were not beneficiaries of international protection nor permanent residents in Ukraine.

# 3. DESTINATIONS OF PEOPLE FLEEING THE WAR IN UKRAINE: THE ROLE OF PRE-EXISTING ETHNIC NETWORKS

## 3.1 UKRAINIAN CITIZENS IN THE EU BEFORE THE WAR

A study by the JRC analysed quantitatively which drivers have a greater or lower relative importance in determining international migration flows (JRC, 2018). It confirmed the findings of migration and diaspora studies that the presence of previous migrants and the network effect are the most significant drivers of migration through all legal channels (see e.g., MacDonald, and MacDonald, 1964; Gurak and Caces, 1992; Windzio, 2018). The presence of a network of relatives and acquaintances can facilitate integration in the country of destination, by providing further assistance on issues such as accommodation, employment, education, as well as overcoming language and cultural barriers.

In this context, the relevance of looking at migration patterns of Ukrainian citizens to the EU and where Ukrainian citizens resided before the war is twofold. First, it helps to understand to what extent the Ukrainian communities in the EU play a role in settlement decisions by people fleeing from Ukraine. Normally, applications for international protection are under the responsibility of Member States within the conditions established by the Dublin Regulation (e.g., presence of family members, legal presence or previous asylum applications in another country, country of first entry). The activation of the Temporary Protection Directive has generated an unprecedented scenario, where the beneficiaries of temporary protection potentially have greater freedom of choice about their destination. Second, the presence of expatriate communities in a given territory is often the result of a relatively slow-paced stratification of migratory and demographic patterns. The sudden inflow of a very large number of newcomers from a specific origin can affect consolidated balances between the different demographic components and generate new policy needs, especially at the local level.

## 3.2 THE DISTRIBUTION OF UKRAINIAN CITIZENS IN EU MEMBER STATES

The presence of Ukrainian communities varies across Member States, by size, reason and duration of stay.

Based on multiple sources, Figure 8 shows that, as of 2021, 1 130 187 Ukrainian citizens resided in the EU, most of them in five Member States (Poland, Italy, Czechia, Germany and Spain). The map looks at the distribution of Ukrainian citizens who usually reside in the reporting country. Usual residence refers to people who have lived in a place for a continuous period of at least 12 months before the reference time or arrived in a place during the 12 months before the reference time with the intention of staying there for at least one year. People staying on a short-term basis are not included.<sup>23</sup>

Eurostat statistics on valid residence permits include Ukrainians authorised to stay on a more temporary basis (less than 12 months), typically for seasonal or short-term work or for education-related reasons. At the end of 2021, Ukrainian citizens holding a permit in one of the EU Member States were 1.57 million (of which 1.2 million with a duration of at least 12 months). This represents the third most common non-EU citizenship for the total number of residence permits in the EU (after Moroccan and Turkish nationals). Their distribution mirrors the one by usual residence for the top destination countries with small differences in the order - Poland (42%), Italy (14.9%), Czechia (12.5%), Spain (6.3%) and Germany (5.4%).<sup>24</sup> In five Member States, Ukrainians represent a considerable share of non-EU immigrants: 68.2% in Poland, 50.3% in Slovakia, 44.9% in Czechia, 34.4% in Lithuania and 28.1% in Hungary.

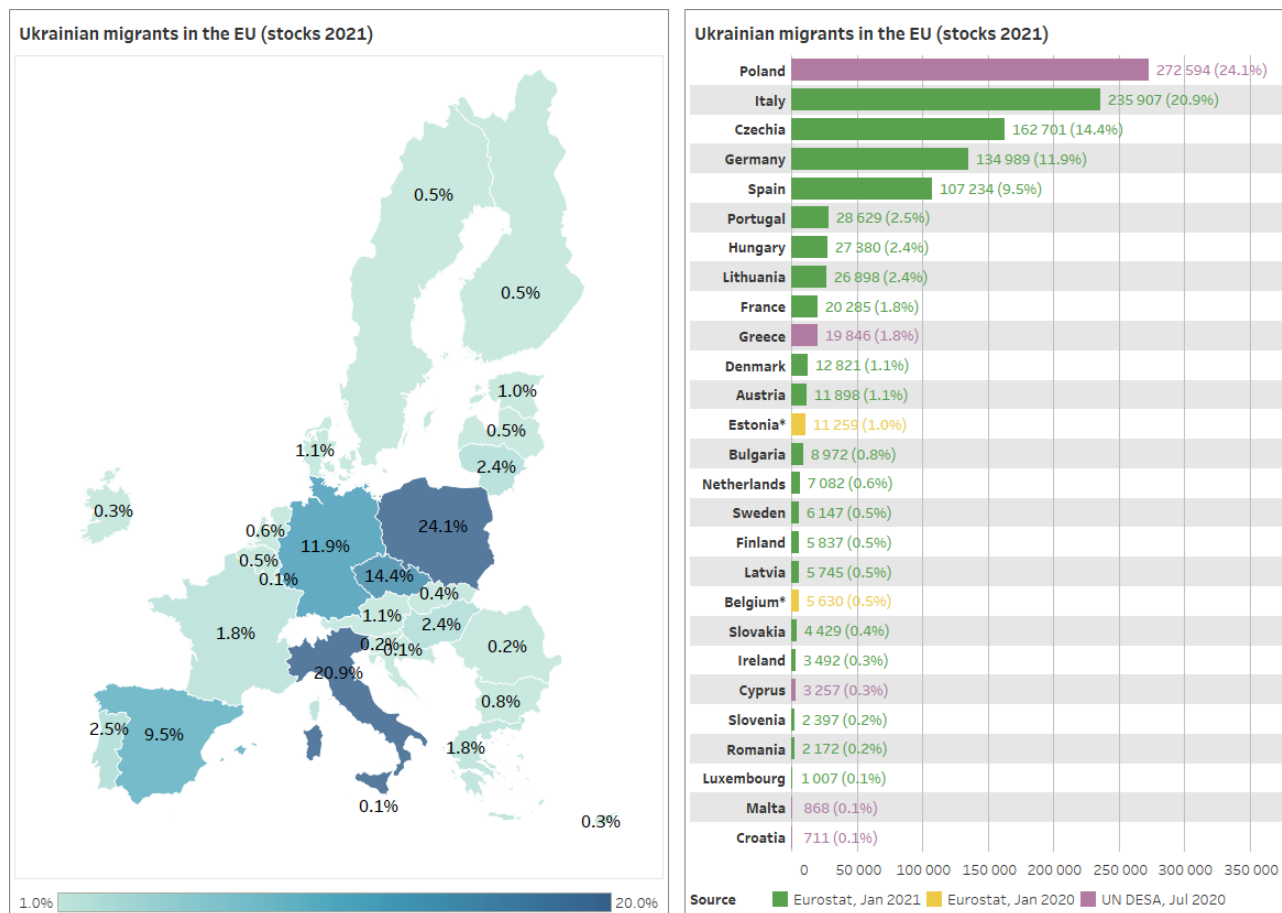
Across Member States, the residence permits held by Ukrainians vary significantly both in terms of reason and duration. Needless

to say, each Member States' national legislation on immigration and labour market conditions play a key role here.

At EU level, the main **reason** for issuing a permit was employment (57.3 % for all permits and 47.5% for those with a duration of at least 12 months). This was followed by family reasons (20% and 26.3% respectively), other reasons (19.6% and 24.2% respectively), education (2.5% and 1.5% respectively) and refugee and subsidiary protection status (0.6% in both cases) (Eurostat 2022). Looking at single Member States, employment is the main reason for migration in Poland, Croatia, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania and Slovakia (Figure 9). Furthermore, Poland accounted for 56.8% of all residence permits held by Ukrainians in the EU for employment.

When considering **duration**, the majority of permits are issued for a period of at least 12 months. However, Poland accounted for 93.1 % of the residence permits with a duration of less than 12 months.

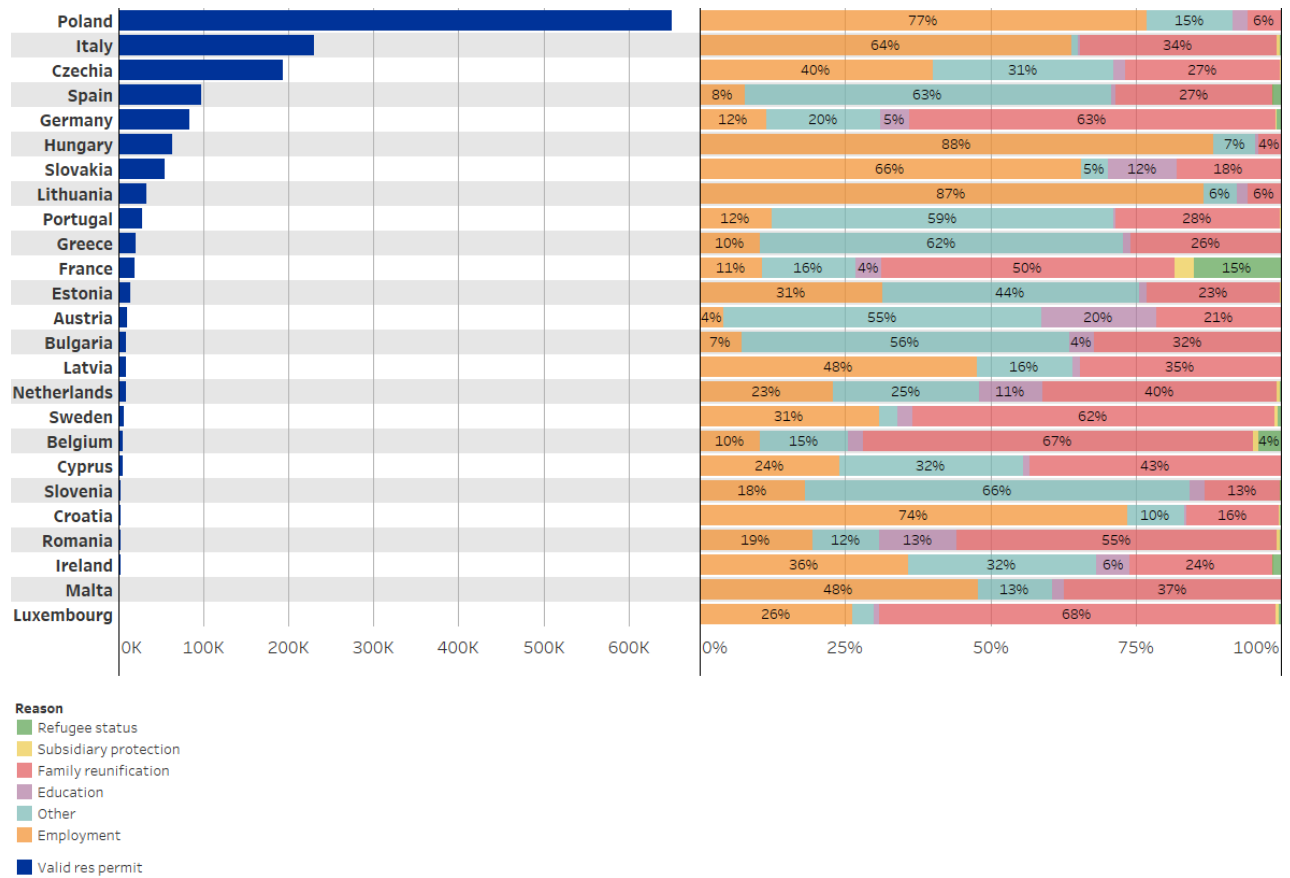
Over time, the presence of Ukrainian communities in the EU changed by magnitude, reason of stay and geographical distribution. Eurostat (2022) compared the periods 2010-2014 and 2015-2019 and identified Poland (78 000 arrivals on average per year in 2014-2019 and 10 000

in 2010-2014) and Czechia (15 000 arrivals on average per year in 2014-2019 and 3 000 in 2010-2014), as the countries where inflows have significantly increased in absolute numbers. In relative terms, Hungary registered an almost tenfold increase, reaching an average of 9 000 new arrivals in the period 2015-2019. A more moderate increase has been registered in Spain and Germany, going from an average of 5 000 and 9 000 to 8 000 and 14 000, respectively. On the contrary, among the top destinations for residing Ukrainians, Italy saw a decrease in arrivals, from an average of 16 000 a year to 8 000 (Eurostat 2022).

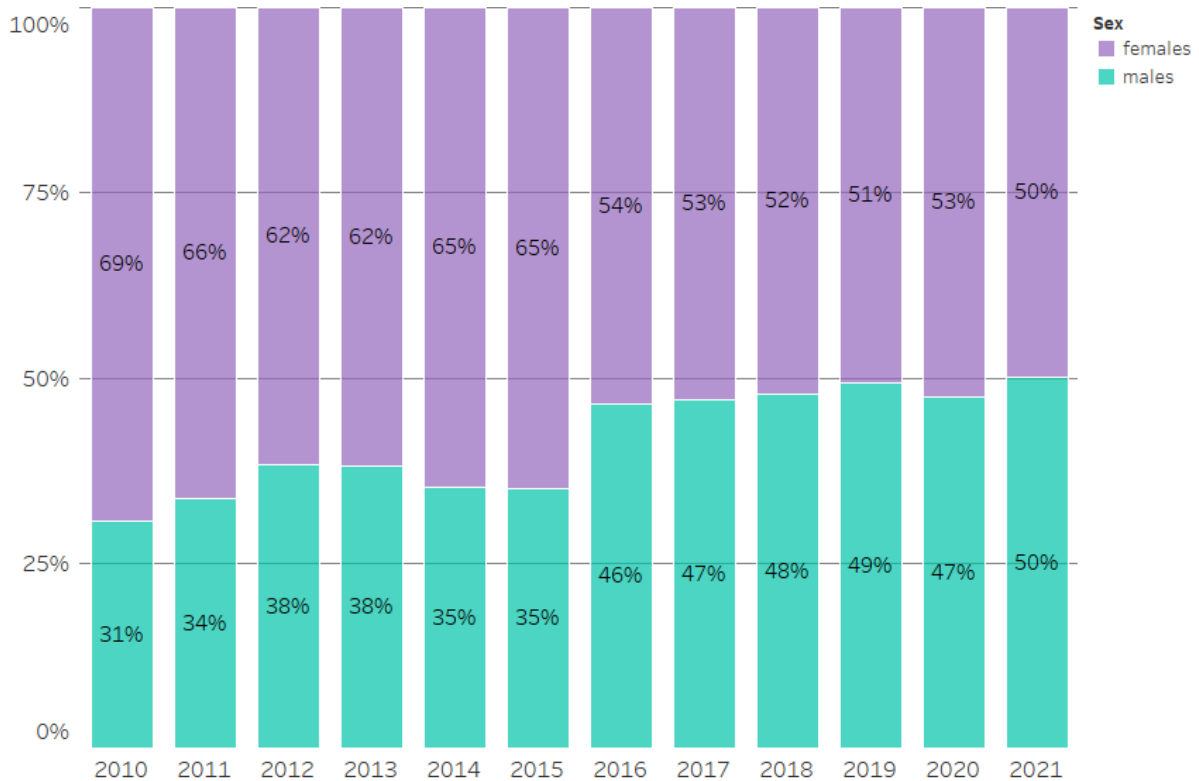
### 3.3 THE DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE OF UKRAINIAN CITIZENS IN EU MEMBER STATES

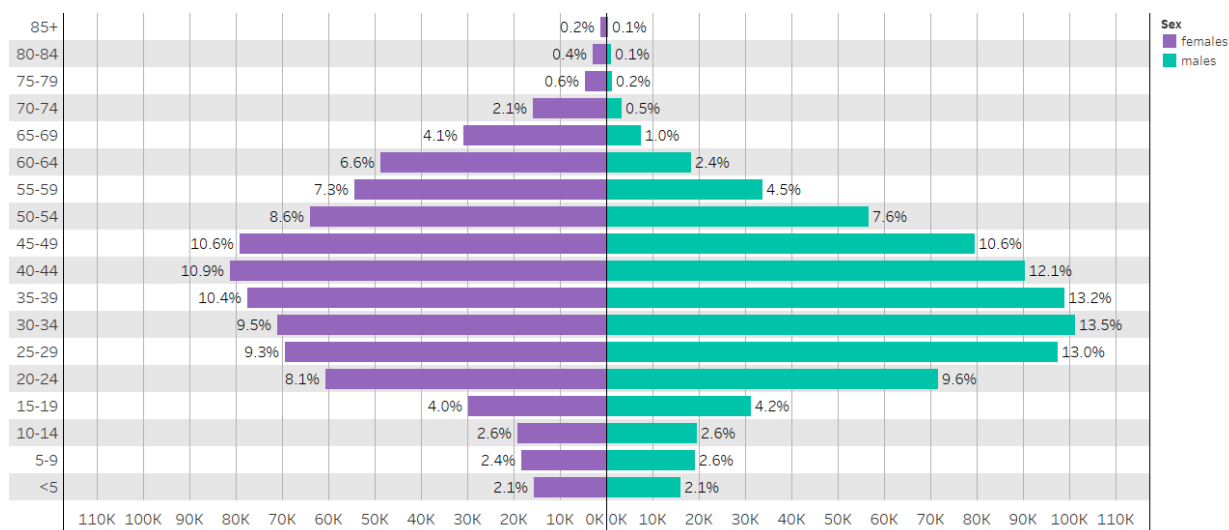
The age and gender composition of Ukrainian communities varies across Member States. At EU level, the gender structure was almost balanced: in 2021, the share of males was 50.1% for the total number of Ukrainians with a residence permit (Eurostat 2022). However, this balance was achieved only recently, as historically the share of females had been higher (Figure 10).

For 2021, the age structures were quite different for the two gender categories of Ukrainians holding a residence permit in the EU (Figure 11). Males prevail in the age group 20-44, while females are present in higher numbers in the age group 44-74. The younger cohorts (below 19 years of age) are balanced.

### 3.4 MAIN REASONS FOR BENEFICIARIES OF TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN CHOOSING A DESTINATION

Since the beginning of the Russian invasion, several non-representative surveys have explored the reasons leading people fleeing from Ukraine to choose their destination in the EU. Comparing the results of these surveys is difficult as they vary in geographical and temporal scope as well as methodology, however they are useful for indicating the prevailing motivations.

The presence of family members and friends in the country always scored as one of the top reasons for choosing a destination according to the surveys. Almost 50% of respondents to the SAM-UKR surveys administered by the EUAA, OECD and IOM stated that they chose the destination country because of family and friends (49% in EUAA and OECD 2022 and 74% in EUAA, OECD, IOM 2022). Family and friends are also the top reasons to choose the destination country in the Kantar Survey (38%, Kantar 2022). Country-specific surveys also reveal the importance of networks: 56% of those surveyed in Moldova based their choice on the presence of relatives (IOM survey in Moldova – March 2022), while 60% went to Poland and Germany because of family and friends (IOM DTM to Poland 16 April – 26 September 2022 and Panchenko 2022). Family or community ties are the other most important reasons for moving to another country (mentioned by 39% of those surveyed by UNHCR, Regional protection profiling and monitoring factsheet).

At the same time, other motivations are identified as relevant: work opportunities (mentioned by 50% of SAM-UKR respondents (EUAA and OECD 2022 and EUAA, OECD, IOM 2022), by 19% of Kantar respondents, by 6% of those surveyed in Germany, and by 17% of those surveyed by UNHCR about moving to another country); benefit and support provided by the authorities (mentioned by 23% of UKR-SAM respondents); geographical proximity (mentioned by 24% of Kantar respondents). Other reasons include language or cultural proximity, educational opportunities, and previous experience in the country.

Figure 12 shows the relations between the temporary protection decisions and a selection of indicators relative to each Member State. The selected indicators are the presence of a community of Ukrainian nationals (measured by the number of Ukrainian citizens with a valid residence permit), the population size, the labour market status (as measured by the unemployment rate), the economic status (as measured by the GDP per person), and the presence of digital social ties (as measured by the Facebook's Social Connectedness Index – Box 2).

Among the selected indicators, the presence of a pre-existing Ukrainian community in the hosting country has the strongest and most significant correlation with the temporary protection decisions in EU. To a minor extent, the social connectedness between Ukraine and the EU Member States, measured with the Facebook's Social Connectedness Index, and the population size of the receiving country are also positively correlated with the temporary protection decisions, and statistically significant. The correlation with the unemployment rate is slightly negative, whereas there does not seem to be a significant correlation with the GDP per capita. This quantitative analysis confirms what both the academic literature and the mentioned surveys suggest that the presence of a pre-established Ukrainian community and relational networks are the most important motivations for temporary protection beneficiaries when selecting a destination.

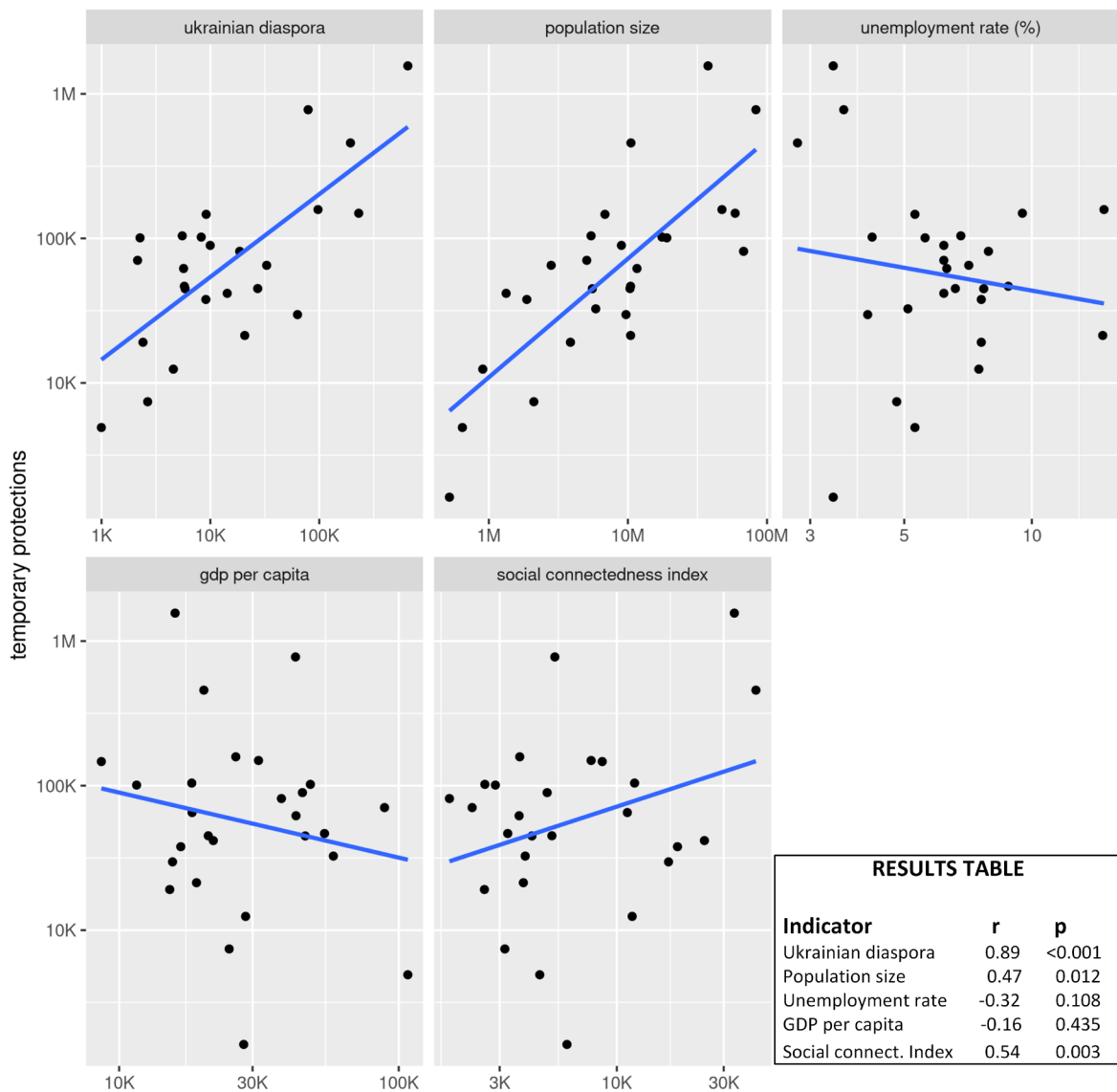


BOX 2 Facebook’s Social Connectedness Index.

The Facebook’s Social Connectedness Index (SCI) (Bailey et al., 2020) reports a snapshot of Facebook users and their digital friendship ties between locations at a specific time. The index can be used to measure the intensity of connectedness between users living in Ukraine and users living in each of the EU Member States. However, it does not certify that users are citizens of that country.

On February 3, 2023, the indicator showed that the highest levels of digital connections with Ukraine were in Czechia, Poland, Estonia, Latvia and Hungary.

# 4. CONCLUSIONS

In the context of the EU asylum governance, the Ukrainian experience is unique for several reasons (OECD 2022, De Somer and Neidhardt 2022, Parusel and Varfolomeieva 2022).

Geographically, Ukraine shares land borders with four EU Member States. This proximity made the EU the only available option for many Ukrainians fleeing the country, at least in the short term. In terms of relationships, the EU and Ukraine had close relationships before the war. The EU and Ukraine association agreement of 2014, and the possibility of Ukrainian citizens to enter and move visa-free within the Schengen area for up to 90 days facilitated cross-border movements, with many Ukrainians coming to the EU for short periods. Prior to the war, Ukraine already had one of the largest established communities in the EU, counting more than one million Ukrainian residents. At the same time, the political stakes were high and it was

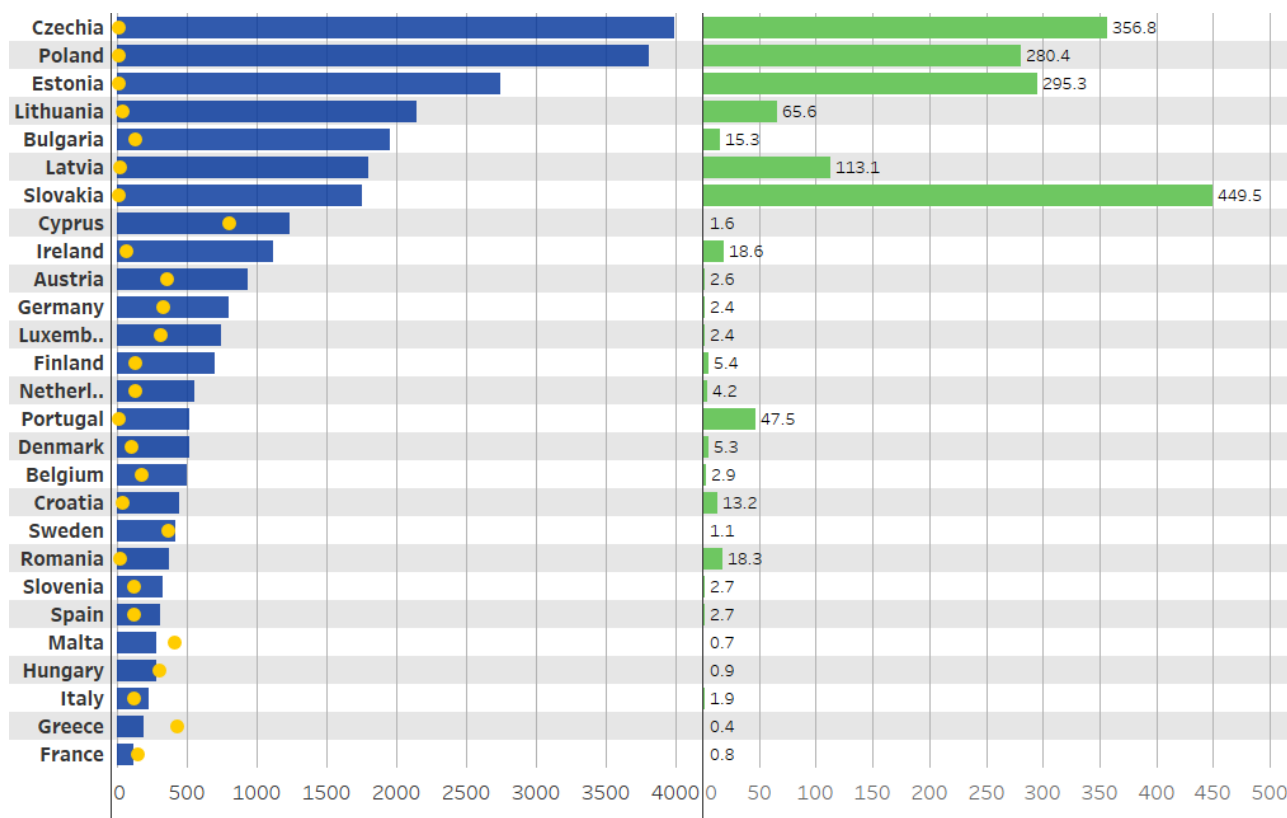
politically important for the EU to show unity and strength in response to the Russian invasion.

The steps taken to effectively welcome people fleeing the war have been important in avoiding a situation where the sudden influx of migrants overwhelms EU borders and undermines EU unity. The activation of the Temporary Protection Directive has prevented unprecedented pressure on the asylum system.

Figure 13 compares the total decisions granting temporary protection with the number of first-time asylum applications registered on average from 2015 to 2021. For almost all Member States (with the exception of Hungary, France, Malta and Greece), the number of temporary protection decisions was much higher than the average number of first-time asylum applications in that 7-year period. For instance, in Slovakia, the temporary protection decisions

per 100 000 inhabitants were 450 times higher than the number of average asylum applications in the period 2015-2021.

For most EU countries, had the temporary protection not been activated, the number of asylum applications would have created unprecedented pressure on the asylum system, much higher than the peaks in asylum applications reached in 2015-2016 linked with the war in Syria.

While the numbers of arrivals from Ukraine reached unprecedented levels, Ukraine is not the only country of origin of people seeking protection in the EU. As of October 2022, the EU had received the highest number of **first-time asylum applications** (658 000, i.e. +19% on the 2017-2021 average) since the peaks of 2015 and 2016, with Syrians, Afghans, and Venezuelans being the top three nationalities (Figure 14). The country distribution of asylum applicants registered in 2022 is more dispersed compared to the historical flow.

As stated by the President of the EC, Ursula von der Leyen, in her 2022 State of the Union speech: “Our actions towards Ukrainian refugees must not be an exception. They can be our blueprint for going forward. We need fair and quick

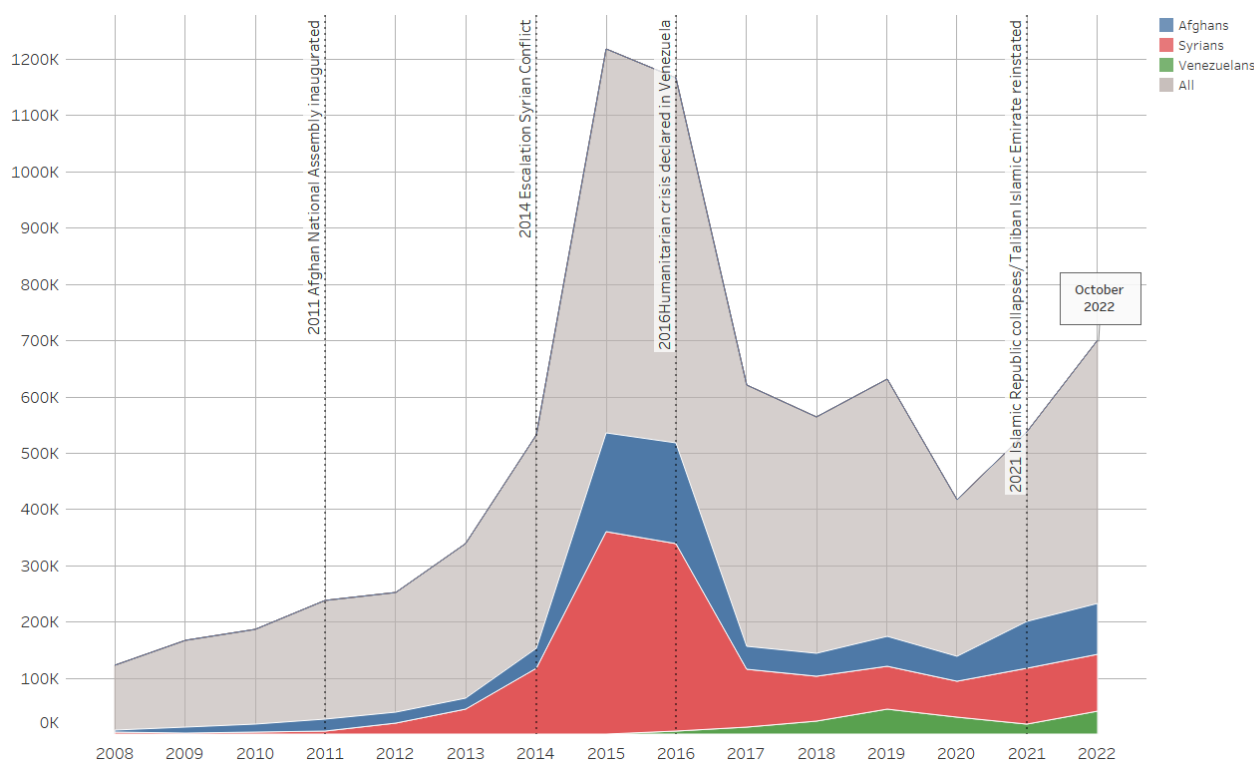
procedures, a system that is crisis proof and quick to deploy, and a permanent and legally binding mechanism that ensures solidarity”.<sup>25</sup>

To this end, the EC had already proposed in September 2020 the *New Pact on Migration and Asylum*<sup>26</sup> for a comprehensive European approach to migration that includes improved and faster procedures throughout the asylum and migration system, respecting the principles of fair sharing of responsibility and solidarity. The European co-legislators (the European Parliament and the rotating Council Presidencies) agreed on a roadmap towards the adoption of the legislative proposals before the end of the 2019-2024 legislative period.

Bearing in mind the specificities of the Ukrainian experience, the exercise in solidarity in welcoming people fleeing the full-scale Russian invasion can be used to draw more general lessons for the entire EU asylum and migration management system.

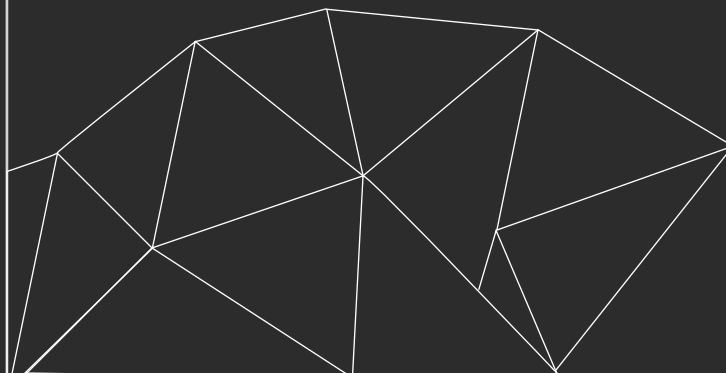
